Christ is Risen, He is Risen Indeed! *Alleluia!*



God's blessing be with you as we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. I pray that you will know our Lord Jesus loves you and is always with you and know the power of the Holy Spirit who is continually leading us and building in us faith in Jesus.

We celebrate this day that Jesus Christ is more powerful than sin, death, and the devil. On the cross, our Lord Jesus took the worst evils this world could throw at him, experienced pain, suffering, abandonment, rejection and death. Sin and evil, poured out on him by people like you and me, tried to destroy the one who had come to save this world.

In the resurrection we see the mercy and love of God that is found in Christ Jesus our Lord. Death did not win. Jesus entered into death and died, but death could not hold him. Jesus Christ is the Living Word of God, the second person of the Holy Trinity, the one through whom life and light was created. Jesus blew death wide open and he rose.

Death no longer has any hold on the one who is life.

Jesus has united us to himself and claimed us in the waters of baptism. Our lives are in Christ. When we die, it is not the end of us—we pass through death into the arms our Living God. Death does not have the ultimate hold over us, Jesus Christ does.

In the story of his resurrection, we see a Jesus who rises from death, opens his nail scarred hands and offers his love and life to a world that rejected and crucified him. He does not condemn those who killed him or rejected him. Instead, he offers love, forgiveness, and eternal life. No matter how we have strayed or fallen short, Jesus offers life and forgiveness. No matter how worthy, or unworthy, we think we are—the merciful and loving Jesus calls us into his life. Jesus forgave those who crucified him, and he forgives, loves, and calls you and me.

Jesus shows us the way of love and mercy by sending the Spirit which is leading and guiding us as we follow. On this Easter Sunday, we thank God for the gift of life we have in Jesus Christ. We give thanks to him for saving us from death and showing us a more excellent way of love and mercy.




