ECUMENICAL ADVOCACY DAYS (EAD) 2018

The ELCA is a sponsor of Ecumenical Advocacy Days (EAD), a movement founded in 2003. The mission of EAD, "through worship, theological reflection and opportunities for learning and witness, is to strengthen our Christian voice and to mobilize for advocacy on a wide variety of U.S. domestic and international policy issues." (from the Mission Statement on the EAD website).

Every year, EAD holds a National Gathering in Washington, D.C. This year's theme is, "A World Uprooted: Responding to Migrants, Refugees, and Displaced People," and is taking place from Friday, April 20th, through Monday, April 23rd. This weekend of worship, workshops, exhibits, and fellowship culminates in "Lobby Day" on Monday, which entails a visit to Capitol Hill to meet with our representatives in order to address these important issues. 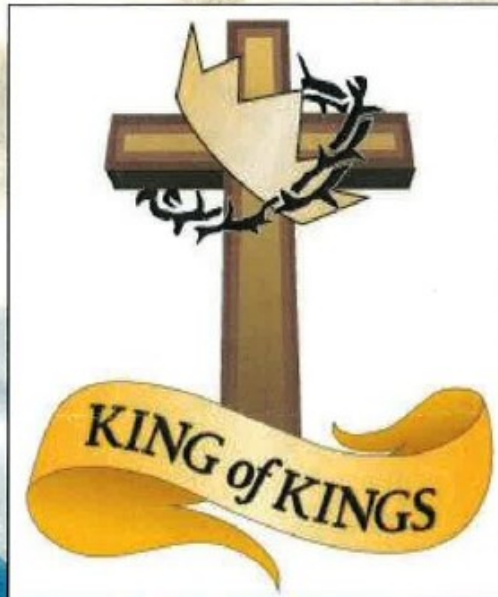


## TRINITY WHEELMEN
