4TH ANNUAL BIKE TRIP FROM STATE COLLEGE TO WASHINGTON, DC

Pennsylvania Interfaith Power & Light (IPL) is a community of congregations, faith-based organizations, and individuals of faith responding to climate change as a moral issue, through advocacy, energy conservation, energy efficiency, and the use of clean, renewable energy. Put more simply, IPL helps congregations think about energy usage as a matter of stewardship.

From May 1-6, Jon Brockopp, a member of Grace Lutheran, will lead a group of IPL bicyclists for the 4th annual bike trip from State College to Washington, DC — 200 miles in 4 days. The cyclists connect with communities and people of faith, led by low-emissions example, and share PA IPL's work and mission. The trip ends with a visit to Pennsylvania offices on Capitol Hill to communicate the message that climate change is a moral and ethical challenge that must be addressed by individuals, communities and congregations, and also our elected leaders, working together in active hope.

Karl Raynar will be joining this year's group on *100 miles of the ride from State College to Hagerstown*. The goal is to raise \$9,000 among the 13 riders. Please support Karl as he represents Trinity on this trip. Karl can be contacted at karl_raynar@hotmail.com.
