We are writing to inform you of the great success of the Kenya Motorbike Challenge which we held this past spring in the Allegheny Synod. You will remember that our goal was to raise funds to purchase motorbikes for our sisters and brothers of the Kenya Evangelical Lutheran Church. Working together, you raised over \$13,000 to help purchase these bikes. These motorbikes are often the only way to traverse the winding, narrow, and mountainous roads of rural Kenya.

To date the KELC has purchased 6 motorbikes with the funds that we gathered as the Allegheny Synod. They have more requests in and hope to be able to purchase a few more bikes for their pastors.
