A new group of council members will begin their 3-year terms of leadership providing guidance and direction for the future.



DEEPER WATERS

This is the name of our Catechetical or Confirmation Class. It refers to how we seek to lead our middle-school aged disciples into a deeper understanding of and appreciation for their faith initiated in the waters of baptism. So, this is an important ministry to assist our young people to move more deeply into the faith we share in Jesus.

Normally, students begin in middle-school, so any and all sixth grade students are encouraged to join the class. We meet on Sunday mornings at 9:30 am, in the Deeper Waters Room (down the hall past Pastor Ron's office). Pastor Ron and Kayla Smith will co-teach this year. This is a 3-year program; at the close of which students make public affirmation of their faith.

FIRST COMMUNION

As families begin to organize for fall activities, just a reminder that First Communion instruction will be offered on Sundays in October. ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL Ronald Porter

The adult Sunday School class this year will be doing a study of St. Augustine's *Confessions* based on a curriculum from Great Courses. Starting September 11, each session will consist of watching a 30-minute video followed by time for discussion. Although written over 1,600 years ago, this book remains a central fixture in the theology and thinking of western Christianity.

Once again a small group study will be led by Pastor Ron. At present, the class is set for Monday nights, 7 pm, beginning on September 12. 
Box Tops for Education

Here is a story about a woman we helped a few months ago:

Megan was a single mother who was sinking to the depths of substance abuse. Being incarcerated was the turning point for her.

Judy Kennedy, a case manager from Interfaith Human Services' Financial Care Program, worked one-on-one with Megan every week to help her with her personal finances.

Together, they paid every bill until Megan was able to do it on her own

Judy was Megan's strongest advocate.

Judy persuaded Megan's landlord to allow Megan topay her rent once a week. This made it easier for Megan to consistently pay on time.

Dear Member Congregation,

If a struggling family approaches your congregation because they cannot pay rent or manage their money, you can always refer them to Interfaith Human Services.

One of Interfaith Human Services' most important programs is our Financial Care Program, in which our case managers work one-on-one with people to helpthemthroughtheirmoneymanagementproblems.

Lastyear, our Financial Care Program helped 71 people maintain financial stability in their homes. No one had their utilities shut off and no one was evicted due to an inability to pay their bills.

Most of the people we support through the program live impoverty, have medical challenges, intellectual disabilities, and/or serious mental health diagnoses.

This crucial program needs your help.

For as little as \$38 a month, your congregation can sponsor a family so they can continue to benefit from the program. You can also sponsor a family for six months at \$228 or a year at \$456.
