## CARE OF CREATION CORNER by Karl Raynar

For some time I have been thinking about writing periodic **Care of Creation** articles for the Trinity *Piper*. I ask others with an interest in this topic to also consider sharing your ideas in our newsletter.

As I reflect on the beginning of 2017 and our first Saturday morning *Laudato Si* discussion group meeting, I am thankful for the interest shown by our Church and other members of the community who joined us as we began our study of Pope Francis' encyclical, *Ladauto Si*.

The fourteen people who braved a 12°F morning were rewarded with breakfast casseroles and interesting discussions. The group is diverse with nine

Lutherans, three Catholics, an Episcopalian, and a Methodist minister – conservatives and liberals – climate change believers and skeptics – all sharing a concern for our environment and interested in framing it in a theological perspective.

We began with St. Francis' prayer thanking God for his gifts that connect us to Nature and concluded with singing Marty Haugen's "Canticle of the Sun", which puts St. Francis' prayer to music. We watched introductory videos on *Laudato Si* and discussed Pope Francis' appeal for Care of our Common Home. Jon Brokopp gave us background on the activities of Interfaith Power and Light and some insights into the theological background of *Laudato Si*.

In addition to sitting in on the class, there are opportunities for action. We initiated Project *Share the Light* to help Food Bank recipients save money and electricity by using energy saving LED light bulbs. Greg Williams will also be leading a group at Walnut Springs Park working on Habitat Restoration by removing invasive plants.

If you missed the first session, you are still welcome to join the group and find out more about Trinity's **Care of Creation** team, **Pennsylvania Interfaith Power and Light**, and Pope Francis' Encyclical *Laudato Si*, on Care for our Common Home in the upcoming sessions on the first and third Saturdays of January and February.

**Homework:** Review Pope Francis' appeal in sections 13-16 (pp 13-16). Read Chapter I "What is Happening to Our Common Home" and Chapter II "The Gospel of Creation."

Reflect on the environmental degradation that we are experiencing and what the bible instructs us to do about Creation.

Come prepared to share the major take-aways you felt after reading these chapters.

## Share the Light

The *Care of Creation Team* at Trinity Lutheran Church has started a conservation and savings program in co-operation with our local food bank to distribute energy efficient one hundred watt (100W) LED light bulbs to families in need. We ask you to consider placing something in the basket located in the narthex to help someone in need to minimize our impact on the environment.

The cost of these bulbs (approximately \$10.00 each) makes it unlikely that a family in need would purchase these bulbs, but they would save approximately \$13.60 per year in energy costs (based on using the bulbs 4 hours per day and local elec-



tricity costs of \$0.11/kwh). Matching funds from Thrivent will be used toward the purchase of these bulbs and supplies needed for packaging. The local Lowe's store has agreed to provide the bulbs at cost.

#### Wanted: Choristers for Ecumenical Choir Concert Showcases Music from Multiple Denominations on Wednesday, April 12

Entitled *Salvation Unto Us Has Come: The Music of Our Faith*, the concert features music from many denominations that has influenced Christian worship: Presbyterian psalm settings, Lutheran chorales, Wesleyan hymns, parts of the sung mass, and choral pairings of the *Magnificat* and *Nunc Dimittus* (Song of Mary and Song of Simeon) as well as African-American Spirituals and Taize music.

Rehearsals are on Sunday afternoons at Grace Lutheran Church beginning March 5 from 2-4 pm, with make-up opportunities for missed rehearsals.
