

# Bishop's Pentecost Greeting 2018

On the first Pentecost the power of the Holy Spirit was poured out on the church. Filled with the fire of God, the Apostles were led into the streets where they proclaimed the good news of Jesus Christ. God's power, the Holy Spirit of God, cut through all that divides people, one from another, and all could hear the good news in their own language. When the Apostle Peter got up to preach, 3000 were baptized. It must

have been quite a morning. We can imagine the Spirit and power of God was palpable and pulsing as it reached out, claimed, and called people into the life of Jesus Christ.

The first Pentecost day was a day of power where the mighty acts of God were witnessed. But, we need to remember that this same Holy Spirit is still at work and alive in our churches. The same power of God that showed up with a sound of a mighty wind and caused 'tongues of fire' to rest upon Christ's people is still with us today. The Holy Spirit called you to the waters of baptism. The Holy Spirit brings together and sustains the church. The Holy Spirit continues to lead us to be instruments of Christ's peace.

On this Pentecost I invite you to ask the question, "How is the Holy Spirit Calling Us?" Each and every one of us is part of the work of God through the power of the Holy Spirit. Greetings from Princeton Seminary! I'm sitting at my desk stacked high with books, dreaming about the summertime when I get to come to serve and learn in your community.
