The PA IPL Circuit Riders are collaborating with National IPL as well as several state chapters to persuade **Ford Motor Co**. to honor the commitment to **Clean Car Standards** which they made in 2011. Those standards would average 54.5 miles per gallon by 2025 and result in a **50% reduction in greenhouse gas emissions!** It would also improve the health of 24 million Americans - including 6 million children -who suffer from asthma. Ford has recently supported the present administration's efforts to step back from those standards.

Our role is to try and gather local signatures on a petition to Ford Motor Co. to add to a 12-foot scroll of signatures collected nationally. The petition would be presented to a local Ford dealership by a group of 6-12 clergy and laity in a half hour meeting with the dealer in the next few weeks. They would also present reasons, from our faith perspectives, why we are asking the dealer to pass on our concerns to the national Ford Motor Co. offices. We have reason to believe that Ford might be persuadable by those faith perspectives.
