

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

No doubt you've heard the saying, "The more things change, the more they stay the same." I thought of that phrase this morning when I heard a rather unusual news article.

NPR was on the radio as I was pursuing my morning routine and one piece caught my attention. Seems one of our state schools of higher education is offering a new program to students. Some of the buildings on campus are kept open and available throughout the winter break. The reason? These students have found themselves to be homeless!

At first, I couldn't believe it. One young woman in her early twenties has been on her own since she was only nine years old. She would stay with friends and neighbors, but she did not always feel welcomed. Of course, she had been abused and used by others. A young man explained how his mother had thrown him out of the house, fed up with his behavior, I suppose. He too, had no where else to go.

The program is meeting with support and "success" in terms of giving this young people a sense of belonging and accomplishment, of value and worth, of hope for their futures that they are not trash, or losers, or deadbeats. There is, of course, a point person, to oversee the program and assist the students, but the program is accomplishing its goals. A difference is being made in the lives of these young adults. In fact, other schools across Pennsylvania are also considering starting a simple program on their campuses.

I would never have thought of young people being homeless, and yet, the more things change the more they stay the same. As we look to Christmas, aren't Mary and Joseph "homeless" as they make their way to Bethlehem. Normally, in those days, people would stay with family when they came to visit or conduct business. As I understand it, the "inns" back then were not safe places to stay. Could it be that Joseph no longer had relatives living in Bethlehem? Or, were Mary and Joseph rejected by their families because Mary is pregnant out-of-wedlock and Joseph, embarrassingly, is planning to marry her anyway? Can't have people like that staying with us, no sir!

Worse yet, even the inn doesn't welcome them. They have no where to stay. Fortunately, there was (and is) a point person, if you will, overseeing their needs. They are offered a shed, a setting few if any of us would accept, and yet, it is in precisely such a setting that God comes to us in the flesh! There is no one, absolutely no one, who cannot identify with this Child born at Christmas, because He identifies so fully with each and every one of us!

Thanks be to God who comes to us in love and welcome, giving us value and worth and hope for our lives and for our world!
