From the Pastor's Desk

September 26, 2021

Dear Beloved of God,

If you look up the word, "worship" in the New Revised Standard Version of the Scriptures you will find that it appears 289 times! So, worship is important to both God and God's people.

For us here at Trinity, we too find worship to be extremely important. Worship is an act we offer back to God and yet when we gather, we know that the Holy Spirit has collected us together on any particular day. Worship is a partnership, as is much of our faith and faith practices, not to earn God's favor, but rather to respond to God's grace and love poured out through Jesus Christ!

For over a year and a half now, COVID-19 has created many challenges for us to pursue our faith practices, not the least of which is worship. While we can offer worship alone or with our families, which we did for many months, worship is much more satisfying and beneficial when we can gather together in person.

As we seek to move forward with the coming cooler weather of Autumn, the council has considered what changes we can safely make to move worship from outside to inside. To that end, the following changes will happen beginning Sunday, October 3:

Saturday worship at 5 pm will continue outside, weather permitting, and meet in Fellowship Hall when the weather requires.

Sunday morning, 8:15 am worship will continue as is (note face masks are strongly encouraged).

Sunday morning 9:30 am service ENDS on September 26 and move to 10:45 am on October 3. The service will be outside weather permitting or in the Worship Space if the weather is inclement. Face masks will be required for this service and social distancing will be practiced.

We also have purchased a fogger to sanitize the pews and other surfaces between the Sunday morning services if the Worship Space will be used more than once.

While many people resist wearing face masks, they will be required particularly at 10:45 am as we have folks who need the protection face masks provide. Please, wear one, if not for yourself, wear it for the sake of your neighbor. Jesus reminds us that God's law can be summarize, "Love the Lord your God will all your heart, soul, strength and mind; and your neighbor as yourself."

Thank you so much for your understanding and patience as we strive to navigate these uncertain waters!





In anticipation of returning to indoor in-person services we have purchased 2 - 4.5L Foggers (If more than one service will be in the sanctuary on the same day, they will be used between the services.
