From the Pastor's Desk

April 9, 2023
Easter Sunday

Dear Beloved of God,

On this day we hear the proclamation, "Alleluia! Christ is risen!" Words we may have been looking forward to hearing for the whole of Lent! The response is just as powerful, "He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!" We cannot summarize the good news of God any more succinctly or accurately. Our one theology professor at seminary instructed us to consider simply announcing this truth on Easter Sunday and saying nothing more: "Alleluia! Christ is risen!" Hard to improve on that and easy to detract from it!

Still, the words do cause us to consider what more can be said and how can it be said to be in keeping with the truth of the Gospel?

Matthew tells the story about the women going to the tomb the day after the Sabbath. When they arrive there is an earthquake and the Roman soldiers, guarding the tomb so the disciples do not steal the body of Jesus and claim he was raised, faint. Then Matthew writes:

But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed He is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you."

Easter, of course, is about the amazing, astounding news that God in the flesh died upon a cross and then was raised to life beyond death! Outstanding. A poet from the poetrysyncblog puts it this way:

Jesus came to earth, To show us how to live, How to put others first, How to love and how to give.	That God sent him to do: He took our penalty upon himself, He made us clean and new.	Calling angels from above, But he chose to pay our cost for sin, He gave it out of love.

Then he set about his work He could have saved himself,

However, you put it, this is the day of resurrection for Jesus which also means resurrection for all of us!




However, we also encourage you to consider the value of what you are donating, because when we sell it at a yard sale, we mark things to sell quickly. If you are looking to get rid of something that is fairly valuable, you may want to consider selling it yourself and donating the proceeds to the Yard Sale. We will accept items of value and try to sell it at the best price, but it may only be for pennies on the dollar of what the item is actually worth. One good venue for selling items is the State College Yard Sale Facebook group.

We also wanted to remind you of something that some folks don't really consider, namely that discards do not equal donations. Donations are either workable items you no longer have use for or items you know that are in need that you purchase and donate. Money you give to the cause. Many times over the years, we unfortunately have had people "donate" broken or unusable items or even outright trash. This is discarding. Please donate what you can, but please make sure what you do donate is in working order and sellable. Also, please review the list of items we can and cannot accept that is on the Trinity website and on the doors to Fellowship Hall. IF you donate broken items or drop off items we listed as not accepted, you could actually be hindering the Yard Sale, because if they don't sell, American Rescue won't take them and Trinity will have to pay for the disposal of these items.


